FRANKLIN COUNTY MICROFILMING BOARD

Microfilming Board

Authorized by Ohio Revised Code section 307.80 and established in 1985, the Microfilming Board is comprised of five elected county officials: Auditor, Clerk of Courts of Common Pleas, a County Commissioner, Treasurer, and Recorder (who serves as secretary). Section 307.80 further states that: "After the initial meeting of the county microfilming board, no county office shall purchase, lease, operate or contract for the use of any microfilming or other image processing equipment, software, or services without prior approval of the board."

Introduction

Ohio Revised Code section 307.805 further requires: "On the first Monday in April of each year the county recorder shall file with the county microfilming board and the board of county commissioners a report of the operations of the center and a statement of the receipts and expenditures of the center during the year." Daniel J. O'Connor, Jr., Franklin County Recorder and Administrator of the Document Imaging Center, and Brian Endicott, Director of the Center, are pleased to submit this 2022 annual report.

Overview

The Document Imaging Center ("DIC") is equipped to provide comprehensive document conversion services to county general fund agencies at no cost and to non-general fund agencies and other governmental entities at better than competitive costs. These services include preparing paper documents for scanning, converting paper records to electronic images and microfilm, digital images to microfilm, microfilm to digital images, film processing, electronic image indexing, and off-site archival storage.

The DIC achieved two significant historical milestones during 2022. With 16.3 million image conversions during the year, the DIC has now converted over a half-billion total images since the Center was established in 1985. This includes converting paper documents to electronic and/or microfilm, electronic records to microfilm, and microfilm to electronic images. The DIC added electronic image indexing to its services in 1999 and with 5.8 million images indexed in 2022, the Center surpassed 50 million total images indexed. These milestones reflect the DIC's dedication to preserving county records, reducing storage costs, and improving record access.

The DIC also improved and expanded on microfilming equipment by decommissioning an aging Kodak i9620 archive writer that had limited functionality and replacing it with a Zeutschel OP800 dual-capacity archive writer. The Center also purchased a Kodak ProStar film processor that will serve as a back-up during production peaks and during mechanical issues with the Allen processor.

A production highlight for 2022 was beginning the process of digitization of old microfiche for each division of the Clerk of Common Pleas Court. This project totaled more than 4.4 million images converted from microfiche to digital images with 3.9 million indexed into Intellevue. This project is expected to last throughout 2023 and into 2024.

The DIC also expanded services to other Ohio counties in need of microfilming services. We are now filming digital images for Licking, Mahoning, and Darke Counties. This expansion of services into other Ohio counties is an example of intergovernmental cooperation and assists those counties in permanently preserving their records and in a cost-efficient manner.

The Center hired four new employees in 2022 – DIC Coordinator Michael Fabiano and three DIC Tech I positions: Jenny Jenkins, Sean Boley, and Filip Nikolovski. These new hires replaced retired employees from 2021 as well as one employee who resigned during 2022. We also rejoined Risk Management's modified duty program that provides a work location for injured county employees during their recovery. Participants assist the DIC in document preparation and logged nearly 670 production hours during 2022.

The DIC is pleased to present the 2022 Document Imaging Center Annual Report on behalf of the Franklin County Microfilming Board. The DIC thanks the Microfilming Board and the Board of Commissioners for continued support for the preservation of the public's important records.
